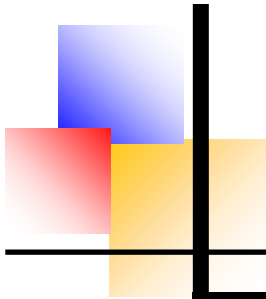


1. MUHARRAM - 1430 A.H.

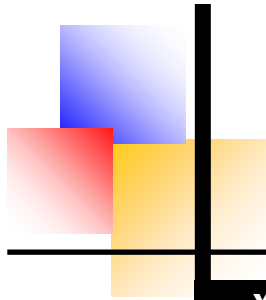
2. SAFAR - 1430 A.H.

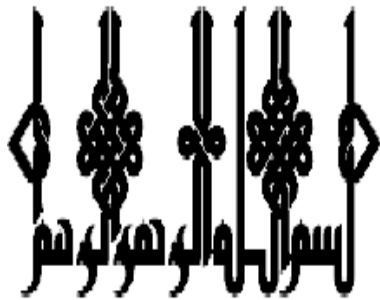

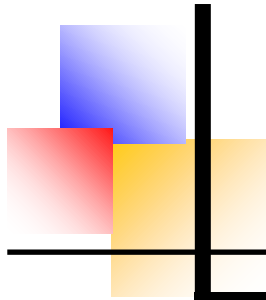

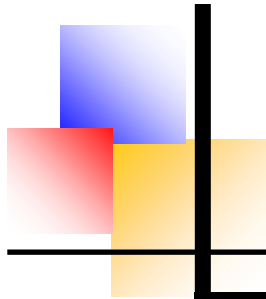
6. JUMADA AL-THANI - 1430 A.H.

7. RAJAB - 1430 A.H.

‘Ali ibn Abi Talib (599-661) was the first cousin and son-in-law of Prophet Muhammad (Peace be upon him). Hazrat ‘Ali was the fourth of the Rightly Guided Caliphs (*al-khulafa’ al-rashidun*) and the first of the Imams deemed by all Shi’i Muslims to be appointed by Divine mandate.

Imam ‘Ali was one of the first to confirm the mission of the Prophet, although he was still but a youth. He was also one of the scribes of the then continuing revelation of Islam.

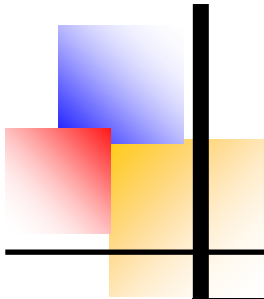
Imam ‘Ali’s spiritual legacy was transmitted to the Sunni world principally through the widespread Sufi brotherhoods (*turuq*; sing. *tariqah*), all of which trace their spiritual genealogy back to him through an unbroken chain of initiatic masters.

Imam ‘Ali’s shrine in Najaf, near Baghdad in Iraq, remains one of the most important places of pilgrimage in the Muslim world.

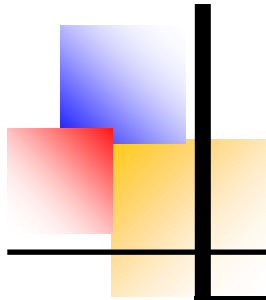


8. SHABAN - 1430 A.H.

9. RAMADAN - 1430 A.H.

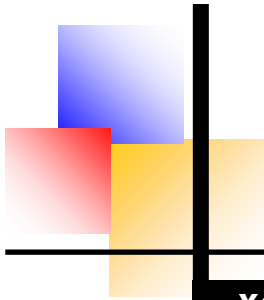
The earliest revelation to Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) was about learning and knowledge. In addition, the Qur'an distinguishes Adam from other created beings by the capacity gifted to him to "name everything" (2:31). The value placed on knowledge in the Qur'an became the foundation for the development of education among Muslims. The incentive to read and learn the Qur'an provided the early Muslim community with its initial educational settings, in which instruction of the Qur'an, the life of the Prophet, and knowledge of the Arabic language, its grammar structures and forms took place.

The mosque and the early Qur'an schools were the first Muslim educational institutions. Informal schools of learning on legal and theological questions came to be developed in mosques and other public places, as well as in private homes. A variety of other institutional settings developed.

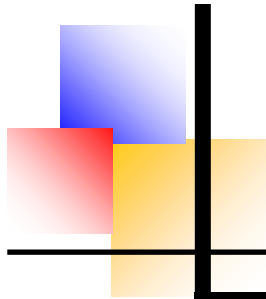


10. SHAWWAL - 1430 A.H.

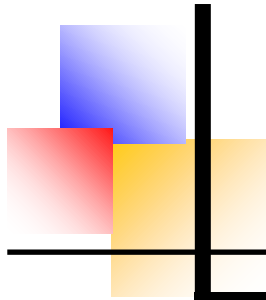


11. DHUL-QADAH - 1430 A.H.
