We believe that an equitable and thriving society is based on the voices of all members being heard and valued. We honour diversity and celebrate our differences, using them as tools in finding solutions to our shared social issues.

We host dialogues defined by respect and conduct thoughtful, rigorous research. We create spaces for young people to learn, collaborate, and speak. We showcase diversity and difference as being catalysts to social challenges at home and abroad.

All Mosaic programs involve active learning and hands-on community service—we focus on thinking and doing.

Next Generation

- Inspiring high school students connected to different sides of historical conflict to learn about and activate their global citizenship
- The program has engaged over 1,000 students from 19 High Schools in Ontario and BC since 2010
- Received the 2012 Community Award for Excellence from the Canadian Race Relations Foundation

U of Mosaic

- Youth-led, peer-to-peer peacebuilding program delivered at 9 University campuses across Canada
- Identifies and invests in student leaders committed to reducing tension on campus, and are connected to local and global issues
- UofMosaic Fellows lead dialogues and activities that contribute to stronger communities on their campuses and around the world

New Beginnings

- Long-form dialogue that brings together diverse groups of young community leaders to foster greater social cohesion and inter-community understanding
- Participants work across communities to identify common priorities for Canada

Innovative Research includes

 The Perception & Reality of "Imported Conflict" in Canada (2014), a two-year study of 5,000 globally connected Canadians reaching over 3.5 million Canadians via television, radio, print, digital and community-sponsored events across the country

Action

- Encouraging young participants to work handin-hand across communities on local and global service projects
- Developing partnerships, training, film screenings, convening influencers across sectors and participating in public activities and events that inform discourse and influences policy matters
- Humanity Wins & Humanity Houses Committee, a committee of distinguished Canadian experts brought together in response to the Syrian refugee crisis aimed at expediting a humanitarian response of Syrian refugees to Canada
